#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is designed to equip students with a five-step interpretative journey that will help make sense of any passage in the Bible by guiding them in the specifics of all the major genres and how best to approach each one.

### **COURSE STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES**

At the conclusion of the Term, the student will:

- 1. Learn how to read the sentences, paragraphs, and discourses of the Bible;
- 2. Learn how to study the historical-cultural and literary contexts of the Bible;
- 3. Understand the authorial intent and accurate application of the Bible:
- 4. Learn how to apply the five-step interpretative journey to the major genres of the Old and New Testaments.
